"Finish Strong!"

I have recently heard the call of Christ to follow Him on a new path in the race He has laid out for my life in ministry. While this path is leading me (and Rachel as well) in a new direction, I have found the Holy Spirit

reminding me that I must finish strong on this leg of my race!

Throughout the Bible, our daily life in Christ is often described as a race. We are called by the Lord to this race, which, by the way, is not a sprint, but more like a marathon. Every new day presents new challenges as we move along the path God has laid out before us and we have a choice to make. Do I stay on this path and trust God in the midst of whatever hills and valleys He lays before me, or do I try to make my own way?

Let me tell you, I've tried my own way in the past and I can say without question that choosing to deviate from God's path is not only ill-advised (translation: "stupid"), but that choice often leads you into dangerous terrain for not only yourself, but those around you.

So, the question becomes how exactly can we navigate this path and run the race the Lord has set before us? Thankfully, we're not left alone trudging aimlessly in the dark. God's Word provides 3 ways found in the book of Hebrews to keep us on the right track.

#1: Remember the "Cloud of Witnesses"

We get our start in the race of life by remembering that we're not alone: "Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses..." (Hebrews 12:1a)

When ancient sprinters dashed off in their quest for victory and the laurel crown, they often did so in a large arena filled with spectators (much like sporting events today). Peering up into the stands full of billowing clothes and moving people looked somewhat like looking up into the clouds.

And that's what it's like for us in our race, too. We're not the only ones to take this journey. People have run this way before, as Hebrews 11 (a chapter that's often called the "hall of faith") explains. Our spiritual ancestors, such as Abraham and Noah, answered God's call and set out on the race set before them. Their example gives us encouragement.

But we don't have to look back to find "heroes of the faith." We can find them today—right in our own pews on any given Sunday morning and throughout the week all around our church and community. Christians are meant to make this journey together, and we're much stronger when we do! Seeing the powerful examples of faithfulness around you can give you the courage you need to move forward in faith. The Apostle Paul sent this note to the church in Corinth to help them (and us) along. "For this reason I am sending to you Timothy, my son whom I love, who is faithful in the Lord. He will remind you of my way of life in Christ Jesus, which agrees with what I teach everywhere in every church." (1 Corinthians 4:17)

Sometimes, however, other problems can keep us from running our race, even when the crowd is cheering us on, which leads us to point #2.

#2: Throw Off the Sin that Entangles Us

If we are to keep in step with the Spirit and keep moving on the right path, we can't do so if we're constantly tripping up. The writer of Hebrews describes it this way: "... let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us." (Hebrews 12:1b)

In the sporting events of the ancient world, competitors usually ran in a much more "natural" way than athletes do today. Long before the days of special sprinting attire, the clothes of the time either had to be tied up away from the legs or taken off before running. Otherwise, the runner would get tangled up and fall on his face.

Our Christian race isn't much different. We can't run very well if we're bound up in the snares of sinful living. Those things that seem so satisfying in the moment can take our eyes off the prize (as we'll see), and instead keep us fixated on temporary thrills. But we're called to a much better path: "For if you live according to the sinful nature, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the misdeeds of the body, you will live" (Romans 8:13)

Life works best when we follow God's Word and obey His commands in the Bible. He didn't give us those commands to trap us, but to *free us* to run our race with endurance. When we do so, our true goal comes into view...Jesus!

#3: Keep Looking to Jesus!

While we may glance at the crowd of witnesses around us and we may throw off the things that tangle us up, our ultimate encouragement is in the prize that awaits those of us who live by faith: "Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the Author and Perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God." (Hebrews 12:2)

At the beginning of our race, Jesus may sometimes seem far away in the distance. We know of Him through the Gospel accounts of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John and the rest of Scripture. We've heard how He has changed other lives. But our race is still new. Before long, however, we come to realize that the prize awaiting us is the Savior of our souls, and He's not content to just sit and watch us from the finish line. He's busy working on us as we run the race. Paul shares this truth as he exclaims in *Philippians* 3:10–11, "I want to know Christ and the power of His resurrection and the fellowship of sharing in His sufferings, becoming like Him in His death, and so, somehow, to attain to the resurrection from the dead."

As we run and keep our eyes on Jesus, God works on us, making us more and more like His Son. Ultimately, He will bring us to our long-awaited reward: "I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 3:14)

Run the race that is set before you, but run it with the hope that God wants you to have in Christ. Trust Him, no matter what, for His sake and the sake of others who have their own race to run (even those who don't know Him yet) and *Finish Strong! Praying for us all! PB*

JUST FOR FUN!



Offer Jesus our King praises by making this banner for Palm Sunday.

What you need:

- 6 sheets of green construction paper (8" x 11")
- Pencil
- Scissors
- 7 sheets of pastel-colored
- Rubber cement or glue
- 7 sheets of white cardstock (8" x 8")
- Hole punch
- Thin ribbon

What you do:


- 1. Fold the stack of green paper in half. Draw a palm branch on one of the folded sides and cut out all 12 branches.
- 2. On the pastel-colored paper, draw and cut out block letters to spell the word *Hosanna* — one letter per sheet. Then glue each letter onto a sheet of white paper.
- 3. Punch one hole in the top of each palm branch and two holes in each letter square (top left and top right corners).
- 4. Thread the ribbon through a palm branch, letter, palm branch, letter, etc. Tie a knot after each hole to keep the pieces from sliding.



JUST FOR FUN!

JESUS IS RISEN!

When Jesus' disciples saw that the stone was rolled away from his tomb, they knew he had risen. Make a moveable tomb to celebrate Easter.

What you need:

- 4 pieces of paper (brown, blue, black, yellow)
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Glue stick
- Brad fastener
- Marker

What you do:

- 1. Fold the brown paper in half, short side to short side. Cut along the fold. On one half, draw and cut out a large half-circle (the tomb). On the other, draw and cut out a palm-sized circle (the stone).
- 2. Glue the brown tomb onto the blue paper.
- 3. Cut a black circle (the inside of the tomb) the same size as the brown stone and glue it onto the brown tomb.
- 4. Place the brown stone over the black half-circle; this is the entrance. Push the brad through one edge so the stone can move from side to side.
- 5. Cut out a cross from the yellow paper and glue it by the tomb.
- 6. Write "Jesus is risen!" atop the blue paper.

Christian Symbol ~ Agnus Dei





- 1. On the cookie sheet, spray shaving cream in a circle (the same size as the bottom of the paper plate). Smooth it out with the craft stick.
- 2. Squirt the blue and green paint on top of the shaving cream in loopy, squiggly patterns. Swirl the paint around with the straw.
- 3. Place the bottom of the paper plate on top of the paint. Press it down gently so the whole plate bottom is covered in paint.
- 4. Lift up the plate and gently remove excess shaving cream with the stick.
- 5. After the painting dries, hang it on your wall.
