Winter Bible Study





- ~Rachel was the wife of Jacob and the mother of Joseph and Benjamin, who become two of the twelve tribes of Israel. Rachel tragically died young,
- ~Anna an aged prophetess was one of the very few to recognize the infant Jesus for who He was.
- ~Mary Magdalene who traveled with Jesus as one of his followers. She was present at the two most important moments in the story of Jesus: the crucifixion and the resurrection.
