Maybe this is why Willie Nelson's song (by the way, Elvis sang it too!), the one named in the title of this article, has seemingly invaded my mind and spirit. After a busy summer day, relax in the shade with this cool drink.




What you need:

What you do:


- 1. In a small microwave-safe bowl, combine the water and sugar. Heat for 1 minute. Stir until sugar is dissolved.

Independence Day lessons for church life



Mission News!!!

Having just celebrated the resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and knowing we are Easter people, one way we can put into action the commandment Jesus taught His disciples "to love one another as I have loved you" is by serving on a mission trip. An opportunity is available through Fort Wayne Habitat for Humanity to go to El Salvador and build a home this fall on the following dates ~ September 30-October 8, 2017!

Trip Cost: The El Salvador trip will cost \$1,280 plus airfare. Depending upon the cost of airfare, the total trip cost will be around \$1,800.

Preliminary Schedule: Saturday: Arrive in El Salvador, Sunday: Travel to Santa Ana, orientation, welcome to local affiliate, Monday-Friday: Work at Habitat site, Saturday: Free day, Sunday: Return to U.S.

What's included in the trip fee: In El Salvador: meals, hotel accommodations, transportation, airfare, and travel medical insurance policy coverage.

What's NOT included in the trip fee: Arrival fee in customs (\$10), money for eating out for several nights during the work week and/or our free day, meals in route, including at all airports, fees to acquire a passport, vaccinations: Please visit http://www.cdc.gov/travel/destinationElSalvador.aspx for CDC recommendation. Each person, with their physician, must decide what medications and vaccines should be taken prior to and during the trip. You should plan to visit at least 4 weeks before the trip.

Fundraising: If it is appropriate in your situation, you may want to consider asking others to help sponsor your trip! Usually a letter or fundraising page is an appropriate fund raising tool. Checks should be marked in the memo line with 'El Salvador 2017 Trip' and sent to Fort Wayne Habitat for Humanity, 2020 E Washington Blvd. Suite 500, Fort Wayne, IN 46803. All fees must be paid by check to Fort Wayne Habitat for Humanity and be paid in full by **August 9, 2017.**

Temperature: Expect weather to be hot and humid. The sun is intense as well. Depending upon the time of year, it can also be very rainy at times.

Transportation within El Salvador: For the time when we are doing site seeing activities we will have a van or bus to travel around in. At the site, our arrangements for getting to the job site may include going by van.

Food: During the days we are working, we will eat breakfast at the hotel, lunch at the site, and dinner will either be at the hotel or at restaurants around the city. We drink from bottled water, sodas, or coffee provided by our hotels. El Salvadorian food is relatively plain and not very spicy although it can be savory.

Work Site: The type of work we will be doing include laying block, mixing cement, digging and pouring footings, building walls, installing a roof or floor. It is important that we be as helpful as we can with whatever tasks we are assigned.



What Does an Awana Classroom Leader Do?

Plan for lessons

- Time Commitment: 15-30 minutes each week (can usually be done at home)
- All curriculum is already written by Awana. Planning consists of determining which games to play, which crafts or activities to do and any other "fun" gimmicks you might want to incorporate. In some cases this will already be done.
 - Sparks and T&T have Game books available.
- Cubbies curriculum have all games, activities, crafts and snacks (if you want to provide snacks) already listed in the Leader book.

Set up for the lessons

- Time Commitment: Time varies depending on the lesson plan
- This can be done just before Awana starts or earlier in the day/week if your schedule allows and if the rooms are not being used by the church for other activities.
- Setup includes anything that needs to be done to be ready for the evening with the kids such as
 gathering supplies for crafts/activities and games, setting up any visual props or slideshows that
 you want to use for lessons, etc... Any printouts that need to be printed can be done ahead of
 time by sending the information to the Bethel Office Manager (Brandi) or the Awana Director
 (Shelby).

Be a Leader

- Time Commitment: 2 2 ½ hours each week
- Watch over the kids during dinner, Large Group Time and Praise & Worship.
- Teach the kids a Bible lesson, listen to memory verses, play games, lead crafts/activities.
- Ensure all kids depart safely with an authorized adult.
- Clean up all areas that were used at the end of the evening (depending on how many leaders and/or jr. leaders are working with your group, cleanup can be done by some while others are working on other duties ensuring an earlier end time for all).
- Note that we try to have Junior Leaders that can help with many of the items listed above.
