"Change in the church is scary, but necessary."

—Pastor Mona

he old joke goes "How many church people does it take to change a light bulb?"

"Change? My grandmother gave that light bulb!"

We want church to be filled with tradition and familiar things. We want to tell the old, old story and sing the old, old songs.

But any church serious about thriving—not just surviving—must allow for and adapt to these important changes.

• Incorporate contemporary concerns

Churches offering real help for today's problems can't help but be attractive. Like Applebee's their "menu" offers appetizing classes on marriage and parenting, aerobics and fitness, divorce and grief recovery, overcoming drug abuse and more.

Note, this doesn't mean forsaking the Bible. Growing churches find creative ways to be current and virtuous. Targeting young people is a wise priority—even to reach adults.

• Involve many in ministry

Too many in church are spectators probably because we've been conditioned to think of ministry as something only for the professional clergy.

Yet true ministry is simply meeting another's needs with the resources God gives to you. It's for *everyone*.

Once, I asked my pastor why our church didn't have a younger women's fellowship for gals like me. His challenging response:

"That's a great idea! What can I do to help *you* get started?"

Like many, I had the "serve us" instead of "service" mentality.

Pastors of thriving churches equip and enable others to be active in ministry. Anything else yields a congregation incapable of growth beyond paid staff.

• Focus outward, not inward

Thriving congregations exist to serve others—even at the expense of personal comfort. Growing congregations ask, "How can we reach folks not yet here?"

For Lent, Bethel church will change slightly to give worship a fresh vibe.

- No robe for Pastor Mona
- Unified start with "I Believe" statement
- Singing together at start of worship
- Longer teaching/preaching time

While you may not personally appreciate all the differences, please know that these changes have been prayed over and fasted over by Bethel Church Leadership...not done on "just a whim" to be different!

We're counting on you to support our church as we intentionally become more contemporary.



• Persevering under trials





Changes on Rummel Avenue

Building Use Policy Change

As our church struggles from a cash deficit position, we have had to take a hard stand against free use of our building. Utility costs have skyrocketed leaving us with a \$9,000 gas bill for a two-month period alone this winter!

As a result, the finance committee recommends the following fee schedule for general events for the public (1-time, up to 2 hours):

Sanctuary use \$100 Fellowship Hall use \$50 Classroom use \$25

For Bethel church members, the fees will be half of the above stated rates.

For events lasting more than 2 hours, fees are higher. For weddings, a separate policy outlining fees for building use, officiants, musicians and technicians is already in place.

Additionally, no tables, chairs are other Church equipment will be rented or loaned out to anyone, per Trustee policy, 2010.

Thank you for understanding our situation, and for helping us to adhere to our financial goal of a balanced budget.
