

God blessed mother with twins on holiday

E very Mother's Day, I say a special prayer of thanks for the one person that made me a mom—an intelligent young woman named Kathy who lovingly placed twin girls into my arms.

Infertile women like me must rely on others to birth children for us to raise.

In our initial meeting, Kathy explains she's not well enough to raise her newborn children—twin girls born over 11 weeks premature. The babies are tiny but strong fighters doing well in the hospital's neonatal intensive care nursery.

Curious, I take a first peek at the children as she proudly shows photos taken at the hospital. Indeed, they are small and thin; lacking much of the usual newborn plumpness but then these babies emerged well ahead of schedule. Most strikingly, they bear their mother's red hair.

I like what I see and so does she.

After several meetings with social workers and attorneys, our mutual agreement of transfer of custody comes about. Ten days later, I am a mother of infant twins, my life changed forever.

As Mother's Day approaches again, I reminisce about my life "BC" (before children). I had multiple hobbies, season tickets to three theatres and still found time to volunteer countless hours for my church and several community agencies. After becoming a mom, my sole hobby is scrapbooking photos of my children.

These days, my children are grown but I'm forever reminded of how God speaks to me. Waiting in the carpool pickup line, my eyes fall across Psalm 113:9 "God settles the barren woman in her home as a happy mother of children" and I realize yet again how blessed I am to be called to motherhood.

For what it's worth, my best friends say I wear it well: I am a good mother. Painfully aware of my flaws, I'm not sure they're right yet I remain grateful for the affirmation.

On Mother's Day, we will celebrate together, my girls and me, because it's the anniversary of when we officially became family. Coincidently my children's adoption was finalized Mother's Day weekend—a fitting ending to such an incredible journey.

At a courthouse in downtown Louisville, two tiny babies were forever placed into my arms and their birth mother forever into my heart. So, my dear Kathy, wherever you are this Mother's Day, thank you from the bottom of my heart for the most wonderful gift of all—the chance to be called Mom in stereo.





UMW & A Baby's Closet





The Seekers have recently started a new series called The God We Can Know. This series explores six of Jesus Christ's "I Am..." sayings from The Gospel of John. This study will help us explore six of those sayings including "I Am the Bread of Life", and "I Am the Light of the World". The Gospel of John is famous for these sayings and even though they are short, once studied within the context of the times, they provide us with so much to think about as we explore our Christian faith. As we study these sayings, we hope to answer the basic question "Who am I?" This series features a short DVD session with Rob Fuquay, senior pastor of St. Luke's United Methodist Church in Indianapolis, Indiana followed by discussion. If you are currently looking for a Sunday School class, and if you enjoy interesting discussions, I think this will be something for you. I hope you can make time to join us for this study. The Seekers of the Covenant look forward to seeing you.

Koinonia (Room S7) Leader-Shared leadership between members

The first Sunday of May, the Koinonia Class will wrap up their study of Maccabees and will have an introduction to Gnosticism by Craig Balliet. Gnosticism is a modern term for a number of heretical beliefs based on the Greek word gnosis meaning "secret knowledge," which the early church fathers warned Christians against in the latter books of the New Testament. It is dangerous because it threatens the church from within. On the remaining May Sundays, Pastor Dan Culbertson will lead a study of the books of Jude (probably written by the half brother of Jesus), John I, John II and John III. Jude addresses false teachers and contrasts the error of their teachings with the truth of Jesus Christ. The three books of John stress the love of God, the love of Christians for each other, and refute Gnosticism.


